Dr Yih Harng Chong

- 63 year old Chinese lady
- GP referral for ? Dementia with 2 yr hx of cognitive decline
- Lived in NZ for 25 years, reasonable English but main language Mandarin
- Married to NZ European husband (second marriage)
- Previous seen by another geriatrician 2 year prior, reassured normal cognition and discharged
- Referred neurologist but patient declined/did not attend as they did not speak Mandarin

PMHx

- Fatty liver with multiple cysts on USS
- Stable thyroid nodule
- CP/palpitation normal Ix with cardiology
- Depression/anxiety
- Hypertension

Medication

• Quinapril 20mg daily

Clinical assessment

- Presented well, provided good detail of personal and medical history
- Still working, running wholesale organic tea business
- Mild inaccurate information (needed prompting to recall how long she's in NZ and daughter's age/birthday)
- Could not recall antihypertensive increased recently (GP noted suboptimal control)? Compliance issue
- Depression 2020 sudden suicidal triggered by husband been hospitalised – reported "cured after 3 days of anti-depressant" and subsequent holiday with daughter

- Denies current symptoms suggestive of major depression
- Collateral history forgetful of events, but major lability in mood, irritable, frequent expressing suicidal threats when challenged by daughter


Cognitive baseline

- MoCA 27/30 2020 when depressed
- 3 months later MoCA 21/30 but off treatment
- Current RUDAS 24/30 (main points lost in memory)
- Normal clock drawing, language components of ACE-III.
- Knew year, month but not date

- MRI brain regional volume loss superior frontal lobes and right medial temporal lobe. No evidence of encephalitis
- Bloods normal

• Working diagnosis depression ? Underlying AD

- Trial sertraline for 6 weeks
- FDG-PET scan



- Early AD
- Commenced on donepezil
- EPOA setup
- Stopped working
- Maintained driving locally since advised to stop at follow up after ~18 months

lssues

- Disengaged with GP
- Lack of culturally appropriate support services
- Recent disappointment with NASC supports (patient remains independent with personal cares), day care not suitable.
- General lack of engagement with dementia Auckland
- Daughter significant stressed. Gave up university, working several jobs. Motivated with participation with clinical trials.
- Husband passed away and disputes with step children. Suicidal requiring mental health input.
- Challenges with WINZ benefit
- Underage for Age concern Asian service



Population, by age and sex, for the Chinese ethnic group, 2018 Census





- COVID further restriction to immigration
- Return to country of origin ? Numbers
- Children residing in other countries
- Difference between 1st generation, NZ born, more recent arrivals
 - language/cultural perceptions/country of origin
- Residential subsidy requirements to access facility
- China's 1 child policy and limited support network


